Principal Objectives

We are looking to employ a dynamic, dedicated and inspiring teacher to teach pupils at our boys' prep school. The focus of this role at Broomwood Prep – Boys will be a Key Stage 2 teacher, teaching a class within our Junior Phase (Years 3 and 4), who can deliver literacy, numeracy and thematic learning in collaboration with our Junior Phase Team, and carry out the associated pastoral duties. We are ambitious for our pupils but believe in helping them recognise and reach their potential in a supportive and encouraging manner. Although the schools have a traditional feel, we are very much a forward-thinking community. Our curriculum is modern and purposeful; we adopt the best educational practices to ensure the learning environment we create is engaging, personalised and challenging. Broomwood places high importance on a set of shared values that we expect staff, pupils and parents to adhere to and we strive to create a reflective and progressive learning culture.

The ideal candidate is someone with experience of teaching Key Stage 2. Strong communication and collaboration skills are required as the successful candidate will work collaboratively within the Junior Phase. Alongside subject teaching, experience of working with pupils in a pastoral capacity is expected. We have a strong reputation for being nurturing and pastorally supportive schools that take a proactive approach to support the pupils in our care. Broomwood has a thriving extra-curricular programme of events and our pupils are heavily involved in the wider school. Our staff contribute to our rich and varied programme of events.

The Opportunity

Key Responsibilities

Each teacher's responsibility is to ensure that every child is happy, hardworking and achieving the objectives set in the appropriate environment (the classroom, the playground, the dining hall etc). The emotional security of each child should also be one of the main concerns of all staff. Teachers should take immediate steps if a child shows any appreciable change in academic progress or emotional wellbeing.

Teaching and Learning

- Demonstrates a secure knowledge of the Year 3 / 4 curriculum
- Plan and teach well-structured lessons that include effective use of resources
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and individual needs of all pupils through effective differentiation
- Ensure that skills progression grids and forecasts are being followed and objectives set in relation to these.
- Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment
- Ensure all topics are relevant to the children and where possible cross-curricular including adequate usage of ICT
- Guide pupils to reflect on the progress they have made and their emerging needs through self-reflection, peer and teacher feedback

Assessment

- Know and understand how to assess the relevant subject and curriculum areas
- Evaluate and reflect systematically on your teaching and the students' learning
- Track and monitor all children's progress
- Identify any children not making sufficient progress and put in place support within lessons; if appropriate liaise with Head of Department
- Make accurate and productive use of formative and summative assessment

- Use digital testing data to inform planning and compare with teacher judgements/ other forms of assessment
- Record formative assessment in planners or on online grids regularly to inform future planning
- Record summative assessment in iSAMs and other appropriate grids
- Ensure regular feedback is given to children and evidenced, through effective marking and verbal feedback
- Ensure reports and any parent feedback is personalised and relevant to each pupil's progress

Pastoral Expectations

- Demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values and behaviour which are expected of pupils
- Be constantly vigilant with regard child protection and health and safety issues and follow school procedures for reporting concerns
- Ensure any pupil issues or concerns are shared with relevant staff
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school, and carry out specific duties, for example: complete the duties of a form or class teacher if required, take on additional duties including tutor, playground and lunch duties, attend church and school assemblies, school performances, sporting activities and competitions, cover classes, participate in excursions or residential trips and communicate/meet with parents who have concerns about their child/ren.

Professional Development:

- Keep up to date with developments in design technology education and best practices.
- Participate in school-based training sessions and workshops to further develop teaching skills and subject knowledge.

- Be qualified to degree level or equivalent, ideally with a relevant postgraduate or teaching qualification

- Be able to demonstrate a knowledge of the regulatory framework for schools and ideally independent schools
- Have a clear understanding of Keeping Children Safe in Education and experience of its practical application
- Be able to demonstrate that they can work collaboratively

- Have an ability to problem solve, multitask and work under pressure
- Be motivated and aspirational for themselves, and their pupils
- Be prepared to challenge and express independent views
- Be an excellent communicator, able to adapt their style and tone whether that is speaking with a pupil or in writing to their parents

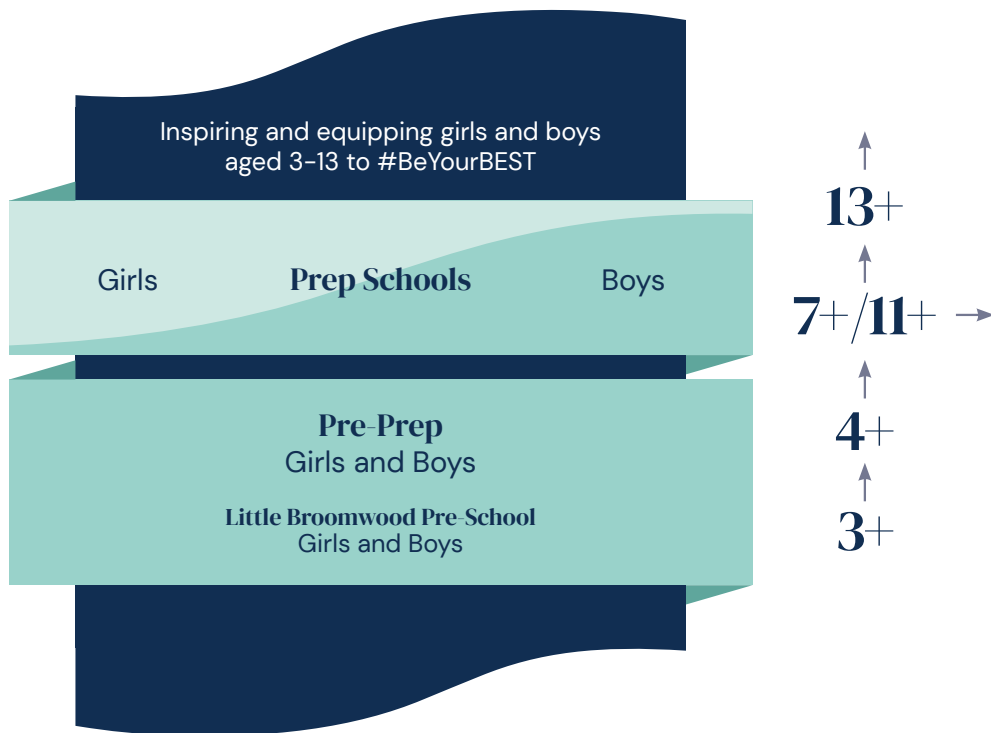

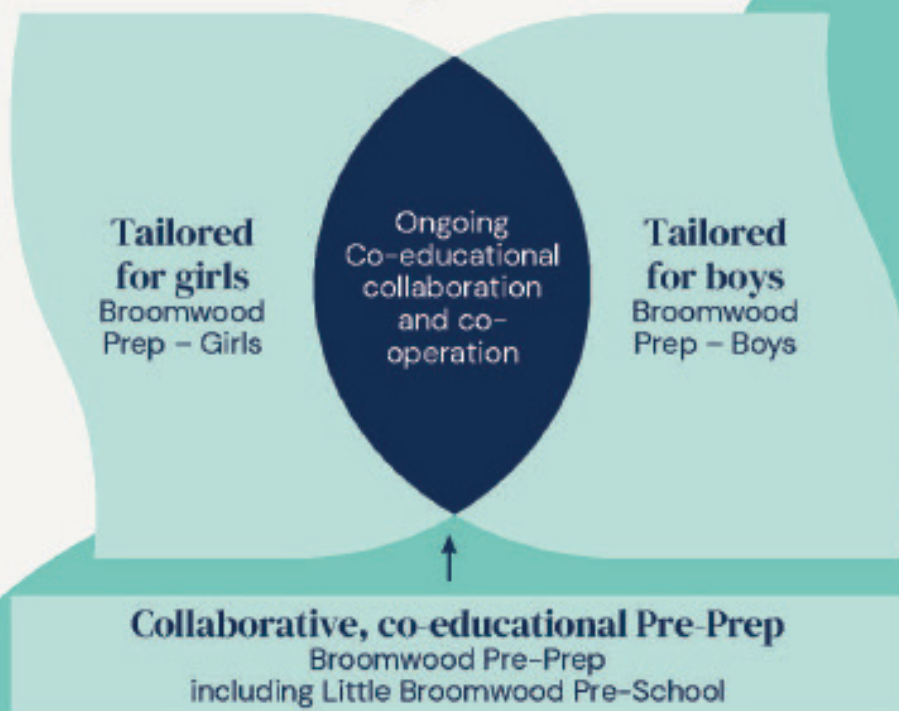
